Dear Parents / Carers & Pupils,

Parking

Following a personal visit from Mayor Dave Hodgson (regarding this matter), I promised him that I would prioritise a reminder about parking in the next newsletter. The school has also been contacted by local residents including parents of pupils at the school to complain about this. Ten years ago, the school opening was strongly contested mainly due to concerns over drop off/pick up on a busy roundabout. In order to make sure all our pupils and the surrounding community and traffic was kept safe an agreed parking plan was put into place.

Every single parent/carer and pupil signs the Home School Agreement, part of which states:

• I will only drop my child off in the designated travel plan place of Melbourne Street car park, (and absolutely NOT outside school)

I implore you to model a good sense of community mindedness to your children and abide by the agreed plan for the good of our pupils and the wider community.

Attendance

Attending school every day is so important. A recent Department for Education (DfE) study concluded that: "The higher the percentage of sessions missed the lower the level of attainment. Among pupils with no missed sessions, 83.7% achieved grades 9 to 4 in English and maths compared to 35.6% of pupils who were persistently absent".

Someone who is persistently absent has an attendance percentage lower than 90%. When considering attendance percentage:

90% attendance = ½ a day a week missed 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed every school year 90% attendance = ½ a school year missed every 5 years

On average, if attendance drops to 90% students see an entire grade drop in each of their GCSE subjects! This is why we use this as our guide:

100% - 98% No concern
98%-95% Monitor carefully
95% - 90% Concern; at risk of
underachievement
90% -85% Severe risk of
underachievement
85% Very probable underachievement

..and why we expect all pupil's attendance percentage to be in the green band.

Another reminder of the parent section of the Home School Agreement:

- I will not plan for family holidays or other extended absences during term time.
- I will make certain that my child attends school every day, except in cases of illness or another legitimate reason.

Encourage your child to be resilient and 'push through' if they are feeling under the weather. Thank you to those families who already do this; you are setting your child up for success, good life habits and employability.

Paracetamol

After half term the school will no longer hold paracetamol in Student Reception. You may send your child in with two pills for the day if you think they may need them. They may keep them in their bag and take them as necessary. Pupils should NOT have more than two pills on them and may not give them to someone else.

Communicating with school

"Parental support is eight times more important in determining a child's academic success than social background. The more parents are (positively) engaged in the education of their children, the more likely their children are to succeed in the education system. Research consistently shows that parental engagement is one of the key factors in securing higher student achievement". DfE, 2011

The section below of the Home School Agreement is 'Parent-School Communication'. You have signed to say:

- I will communicate with the school in a timely and polite manner, in line with the School's values
- I will read all reports carefully, attend all parent meetings and check and sign my child's Achievement Card each
 week

Please be reassured that we always want the best for your children and will achieve this working alongside and in harmony with you. Please remember this when you are talking to staff. You will get the best from them if all conversations remain civil and all parties operate with the knowledge that there is a shared common purpose: to garner success for your child. As a response to feedback about school communication we are looking to employ another receptionist to help with answering the phones. If you are interested in this job keep an eye on the website.

To alleviate the very high number of incoming phone calls, please put plans in place so that your child knows exactly what to do if they are leaving school later than usual. For example, pupils with a sibling in school should both know what to do and where to go if the other gets a correction or has an intervention. Sometimes it is very difficult or even totally impossible to get messages to pupils in the time frame that some parents expect.
