## Dear Parents / Carers & Pupils,

### **Best GCSE results ever!**

It has been such a busy and purposeful Autumn Term. A particular high note was the celebration event held for the Class of 2023. The ex-Year 11 collected their GCSE certificates and nominated subject prizes, heard speeches from School Leaders and watched a video (thanks to Miss Damon) summarising their time at BFS in photo images and short reels. Here is an extract of my speech:

"Bedford Free School is a centre of excellence. It is a school where conduct is so good that all pupils can hear and listen to their teachers, who teach great knowledge, really well, and as a result of great behaviour pupils can learn all of that knowledge and make amazing progress. Success is desirable, demanded and achievable - and achieved.

2023 GCSE results placed BFS 1st in Bedfordshire and 76th in the country – out of about 3500 secondary schools. Amazingly - this year YOU achieved the best set of results that pupils from Bedford Free School have done, so far – which is pretty good considering your predecessors GCSE results have already been phenomenal."

#### More events this term...

This term there have been various trips including in September when 54 **GCSE RE** pupils visited 2 iconic London religious building, London Central Mosque and St. Paul's Cathedral, where they learnt first-hand how Muslims and Christians practice their faiths.

On  $1^{st}$  November nearly one third of Year 11 pupils travelled to a very wet and windy but beautiful Dorset coastline where they had an exciting three days conducting **geography field studies** which will feed into knowledge they must have for 30% of the geography GCSE paper.

Later on in November, Miss Entwistle took 5 Year 10 pupils to their first **Wadham (Oxford University) Project** seminar at Biddenham School. They joined approximately 50 other Year 10 pupils from a range of Bedford state schools and were congratulated on being selected to be part of the project run by Wadham College, Oxford. They were given in-depth seminars on Genetic Research and History of Art to develop their GCSE knowledge, broaden their horizons and start to consider options for study at university. They all got fully

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involved and travelled back to school with lots to discuss from each seminar. We look forward to the next seminars in January.





In **PE** pupils have taken part in a huge variety of fixtures including, netball, football, badminton, sitting volleyball, table tennis, indoor athletics, gymnastics, cheerleading, dodgeball, and basketball. Year 11 have been working hard on the theory elements of their GCSE in preparation for their mock and actual GCSE exam later in the year. We have also started our Advantage Schools varsity between Bedford Free School and Houstone School and we look forward to more varsity fixtures in the future. The PE department and school are so proud of all pupils who have played in fixtures this Autumn Term and congratulate you for your efforts. We can't wait to welcome the new year and new term with indoor sports in lessons, and Spring fixtures which will include handball, cross country, football, and rugby, to name but a few!







The school **choir** have had a busy couple of weeks, performing in Bedford. On Sunday 3rd December, they performed at the Bedford Christmas Flea Market and brought festivities to passers-by on Riverside Square. They then performed at the BFS Winter Showcase at the Salvation Army Congress Hall on 7th December. Both performances were hugely enjoyable, and students were complimented greatly on their wonderful singing and enthusiasm. They look forward to performing in the End of Term Christmas Assembly on the final day of term. Thank you to the music and drama teachers for coaching and supporting them in this.



In early December the English Department entered and supported 3 of our pupils in the English-Speaking Union (ESU) **Public Speaking Competition** 2023. Elizabeth, Abbie and Rua, all from Year 9, were outstanding, and their performance meant that BFS was amongst three schools out of six to progress through to the next round in February. Congratulations to these talented girls and the very best of luck to them for the stage of the competition.

Thank you to the families of Bedford Free School who donated individual food items to the **Christmas in a box** appeal. We managed to give 19 Christmas hampers to charity, packed with Christmas essentials. Tremendous generosity by our community.
